The Centre for Innovation in Science and Social Action (CISSA) launched the innovative Sahasradalam 2024' - a programme for developing entrepreneurship among shareholders of Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) in Thiruvananthapuram District of Kerala State. The programme aims to establish 1,000 micro agribusinesses, demonstrating the critical role that small businesses play in promoting economic opportunity, employment, and sustainable development, This represents a bold step towards transforming the economic landscape of Thiruvananthapuram District through the power of micro-agribusinesses by focusing on financial inclusion, income generation, sustainable development, and entrepreneurship support,Sahasradalam aims to create a thriving ecosystem where small businesses can flourish, contributing to the broader goal of economic prosperity among farmers. This is a collaborative effort between the Govt of India schemes, Industries, and Agricultural Departments of Govt of Kerala and banking sectors. This Project utilizes various central Government schemes such as PMFME, PMEGP, AIF, Mudra Loan, KCC Loan, etc, alongside the State Industries Department's schemes, particularly the One Family One Enterprise Scheme, to initiate entrepreneurship.

Collaborations with financial institutions ensure accessible loans, grants, and subsidies for micro agribusinesses, addressing the needs of small-scale entrepreneurs and providing the financial support necessary for economically backward farmers.

### Modus Operandi

All the FPOs under CISSA conducted entrepreneurship workshops for those interested in starting enterprises. Each workshop was attended by officials from the State Industry, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry departments, bank officials, and experts from CISSA. During the workshop, various schemes such as PMFME, PMEGP, AIF various loan schemes, and SHM schemes were explained. Each participant presented their ideas and needs, and doubts were cleared within the workshop. The Chairman, the Directors, and the CEOs contacted each potential entrepreneur individually to discuss their project, and prepared project reports, which were to be submitted to the bank with the help of officials from the Industries Department. The FPO provided all technical advice regarding technology, machinery, marketing plans and supported the entrepreneurs until their enterprises were established on the ground.

### **FOREWORD**

The Government of India's farmer welfare programs cover a broad range of topics- crop insurance, soil health management, financial support to food processing industries, marketing and export promotion schemes, etc. Financial support schemes like PMFME, AIF, PMFBY, KCC, PMEGP, AHIDF, etc, focus on financial support and low-risk loans for farmers. However, the main task is to make these schemes accessible to farmers and entrepreneurs.

Many small-scale farmers are left behind from the numerous programmes designed to support the agriculture sector, either because they are not aware of the resources available to them or because they are unable to navigate the complicated maze of administration. Ignorance is still a powerful obstacle. Farmers, frequently cut off from mainstream media, find it difficult to understand the scope of prospects and financial help offered by government agencies and banks. This presents a challenge for FPOs to properly close the gap between schemes and beneficiaries by providing hand-holding.

Educating farmers is pivotal. Banks, as primary financial intermediaries, must not only part with loans but also play a proactive role in guiding farmers through the complexity of financial support mechanisms. Simplifying processes and offering clarity can save farmers precious time and prevent them from languishing in bureaucratic difficulties for months on end. FPOs must increase their outreach efforts. Deploying more agents into rural communities, equipped with knowledge and passion to empower farmers, can ensure that every eligible individual benefits from these schemes. More than disseminating information; it's about fostering a culture of understanding and participation in National development.

Ensuring that farmers receive a share of the profit from FPOs is essential for maintaining the loyalty of shareholders in the FPO. *The mission of the FPO will be fulfilled only when its shareholders* experience income growth. While the profitability of the FPO is important for shareholders, for them, their individual benefits take first priority. Farmers' needs should be met individually, in addition to viewing them as members of a company or a cooperative. Each farmer should receive individualized help from the administrative management of the FPOs. The proper process and eligibility for the schemes should be communicated clearly and made accessible to them. This approach led to the success of Sahasradhalam 2024, launched by the CISSA focusing on micro-agricultural businesses in Thiruvananthapuram district. As we attempt to improve agriculture, let us keep in mind that our farmers have aspirations that go beyond simply making ends meet; they exhibit bravery and a drive for advancement. On April 4, a five-member women's FIG group from Grama Samridhi FPO in Karode Panchayat started a value-addition unit named Dhanya Food Products. This initiative embodies the entrepreneurship and agricultural empowerment of women. The production plant makes a range of tapioca products with added value, such as tapioca chips, dried tapioca, *tapioca papad, tapioca powder, and other* kinds. The project was sanctioned under the PMFME Scheme with funding of 10 lakhs with a 35% subsidy. ## Exploring Export Opportunities for FPOs



Chairmen and CEOs of FPOs in Thiruvananthapuram district and Yashvasin Logistics – a storage and exporting company held a crucial meeting on May 14, 2024. The discussion focused on a strategy to collaborate with FPOs for sourcing high-quality bananas, specifically Kerala Nendran and Red bananas, directly from local growers for export to international markets.

Mr. Prakash Nair, Director of Yashvasin Logistics, explained the company's role as a marketing agency dedicated to exporting premium bananas. He emphasized the importance of maintaining a steady supply chain and catering to the unique needs of customers in the Far East, Europe, and the Middle East. The upcoming Vizhinjam port near Thiruvananthapuram was identified as a critical hub for this export strategy. With its state-of-the-art infrastructure, the port will optimize logistics, ensuring efficient transportation and perfect conditions upon arrival. This partnership promises significant benefits for local farmers. By working with Yashvasin Logistics, farmers will have a consistent market for their produce and receive fair prices. This initiative is expected to improve farmers' livelihoods and stimulate the local economy.



For FPOs and entrepreneurs aiming to export via Vizhinjam Port, understanding and complying with foreign regulations is essential. Different countries impose specific requirements on imported goods, including ingredients, quality standards, and packaging specifications. Adhering to these regulations enhances product acceptance and market competitiveness abroad. The cold storage facility provided by Yashvasin Logistics at Vellanad near Thiruvananthapuram, which will be operational in the next 3 months can be utilized for storing bananas at 12-15 °C, depending on the variety, with a humidity rate of 90-95% under a controlled atmosphere chamber with a capacity of 500 metric tons. Yashvasin Logistics will handle the entire export process, from collecting bananas based on buyer requirements to ensuring timely and safe delivery to international destinations. This includes quality checks, packing, and transportation, leveraging the company's expertise in logistics for seamless operations.



### Distribution of Tuber Crop Planting Materials



The selected farmers from Grama Samrudhi Farmer Producer Company received 150 kg each of free planting materials from Central Tuber Crops Research Institute (CTCRI), Thiruvananthapuram.

The distribution took place on April 2, 2024. Seedlings of various types of tuber crops developed by CTCRI like, Sree Keerthi, a variety of Elephant foot Yam, 'Gajendra,' a variety of Purple Yam, and 'Sree Dhanya,' a variety of white Yam were distributed at the function.

Sree Dhanya can be harvested in nine months, does not require bracing, and can accommodate close spacing. It can be grown as an intercrop with bananas and in mature coconut groves, yielding an average of 20 tonnes per hectare. Gajendra, a yam variety, matures in 8-9 months and averages 42 tonnes per hectare. It has immunity against stem rot and mosaic disease. Cultivating Gajendra as an intercrop with Nendran banana provides farmers an additional income of Rs 2,000 per hectare over a banana as a sole crop.



Dr. Mahesh Kumar, Principal Scientist and Head of Crop Production at CTCRI, led the distribution of the planting material. Following this, Mr. Rejin D. T., Technical Assistant at CTCRI, conducted a training program on the package of practices for yam cultivation, providing valuable insights to the farmers on best cultivation techniques.

Dr. Suresh Kumar, General Secretary of the CISSA highlighted the potential benefits of tuber crops in enhancing food security and improving farmers' livelihoods. Chairman Mr. Ramachandran Nair, CEO Smt. Jyoti V.A. and shareholders participated.
